

Annex H – Family Farm Legislations

Moldova	Family Farm is an individual enterprise, based on private property on agricultural land and other goods, on the personal labor of members of a family (members of the peasant household), having as the purpose of obtaining agricultural products, their primary processing, the predominant marketing of their own agricultural production. The full name of the family farm will contain the words farmer's house, the name of the founder (the leader). Poland	The basis of the agricultural system of the State shall be the family farm. Purchase of land is conditional on personal involvement in the farm, at least five years of local housing, and education or agricultural practice. Portugal	'family farming' means the organization of productive activities, management of the environment and support of social life in rural areas, based on a family farm; 'family farm' means an agricultural holding where the family labor force, measured in Annual Work Unit, accounts for more than 50% of the total workforce of the farm; Act on Family Farm of 64/2018 Decreto-Lei n. 64/2018 Consagra o estatuto da agricultura familiar https://dre.pt/home/-/dre/115933868/details/maximized)
Romania	<i>Through Emergency Ordinance of the Government (OUG) no. 64/2013 the calculation basis of a family farm changed from EDU to SO (Standard Output of the agricultural production). The following definition was created: "family farming – agricultural exploitation belonging to a family enterprise or a juridical personality of which associates are exclusively members of the same family. The economic dimension of a family farm is between 8000 – 250 000 SO. Through same family members are understood wife/husband and relatives up to and including grade III."</i>
Hungary	'family farm' shall mean an agricultural holding registered by the agricultural administration body as a family farm; Act CXXII of 2013 on Transactions in Agricultural and Forestry Land http://njt.hu/cgi_bin/njt_doc.cgi?docid=161522.370228) § 4 Family farm determined in Article 5 (4) of the Transactions in Agricultural and Forestry Land shall mean, until the entry into force of a separate law stipulated in Article 1 (2) of the Transactions in Agricultural and Forestry Land, the land owned and used by the family members and other real estate and movable property belong to the land, including in particular buildings, structures, agricultural equipment, machinery, installations, livestock, inventory, which is utilised by the full employment of one family member and with the cooperation of other family members according to an agreement concluded between

	members of the family; which agreement is registered as a family farm by the agricultural administration.
